Welcome to the Technology Readiness User Evaluation (TRUE) Initiative's annual report for 2024. This document highlights our continued mission to enhance Hawaii's economic sustainability and quality of life through strategic technology adoption and cross-sector collaboration.



Executive Summary

In 2024, the Technology Readiness User Evaluation (TRUE) Initiative continued its mission of enhancing Hawaii's economic sustainability and quality of life by accelerating technology adoption across local organizations. TRUE's strategic focus remains on addressing cost-of-living disparities identified in the ALICE Report, leveraging technology to enhance efficiency, innovation, and competitiveness within Hawaii's diverse sectors.

Throughout the year, TRUE successfully facilitated impactful projects, including the significant expansion of the Homeless Care Coordination App in collaboration with the Institute for Human Services (IHS), NEC, and DataHouse. This initiative onboarded 52 new users and enrolled over 600 clients, providing essential coordinated services to 210 individuals. Additionally, TRUE secured a \$150,000 City & County of Honolulu grant to further scale this initiative, demonstrating TRUE's effectiveness in attracting support and resources to drive meaningful social impact.

TRUE also hosted notable events such as the Hawaii AI & Cloud Innovation Summit, which saw record participation of 594 attendees and received exceptional satisfaction ratings (4.42/5). These events, along with exclusive AI Executive Sessions, positioned TRUE as a leading facilitator of critical technology discussions among Hawaii's business leaders, significantly enhancing statewide collaboration and innovation.

Through partnerships and targeted workforce initiatives like GameDevHQ, TRUE actively contributed to the creation of over 10 new technology roles, each averaging salaries around \$120,000 annually, underscoring TRUE's tangible impact on Hawaii's economic growth and workforce development.

Overall, TRUE's accomplishments in 2024 underscore its vital role in fostering technology-driven economic resilience, cross-sector collaboration, and sustainable community enhancement, setting a robust foundation for continued progress and innovation in 2025.

About TRUE

Established in 2019, the Technology Readiness User Evaluation (TRUE) Initiative drives economic and community improvement in Hawaii through strategic technology adoption and collaboration. TRUE was created in direct response to the economic inequities highlighted by the ALICE Report, addressing Hawaii's high cost-of-living through innovative solutions.

TRUE's vision centers around tech-enabling local organizations to become more efficient, competitive, and sustainable. By adopting advanced technologies, organizations can enhance operational efficiencies, reduce costs, and create higher-quality employment opportunities.



A foundational goal of TRUE is to mitigate cost-of-living inequities in Hawaii by fostering an environment where businesses thrive through technology-driven improvements, creating higher-paying, sustainable jobs for residents.

Key Initiatives in 2024: Tech Enablement Programs



Community Innovation Mentorship Program (CIMP)

Designed to accelerate technology adoption among Hawaii's local businesses and non-profits through direct mentorship, collaboration, and knowledge sharing. In 2024, CIMP successfully paired local organizations with experienced mentors, providing targeted guidance for technology integration.



Notable Outcomes

Enhanced operational efficiencies and expanded service capacities for participating organizations. Highlighted case studies include collaborations with small businesses and educational institutions, demonstrating successful technology integration and tangible improvements in productivity and customer engagement.

Institute for Human Services (IHS) Tech Enablement

The Homeless Care Coordination App pilot project was a flagship initiative in partnership with the Institute for Human Services (IHS), NEC, and DataHouse. This comprehensive tech solution streamlined case management and service delivery processes, significantly reducing redundancies and improving data visibility.

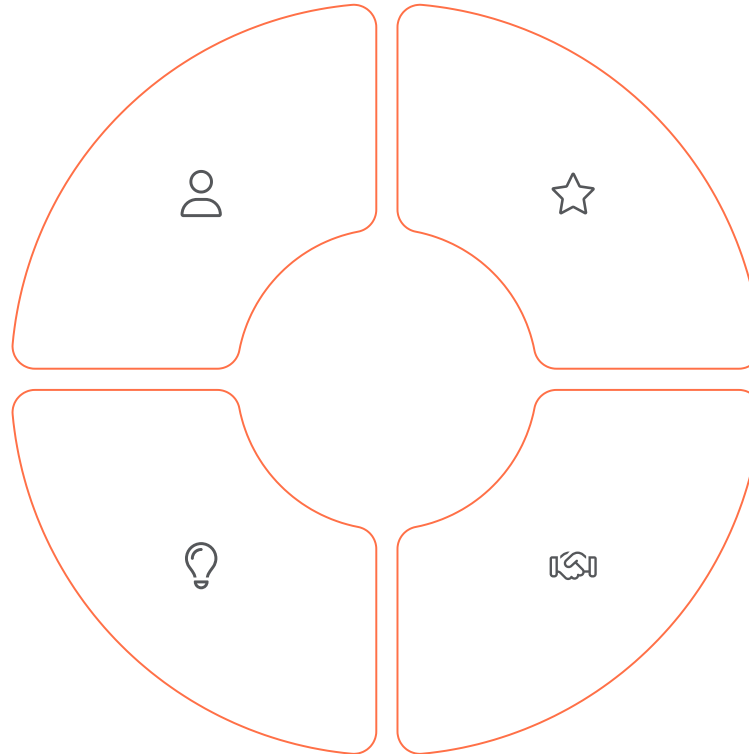

Digital Engagement

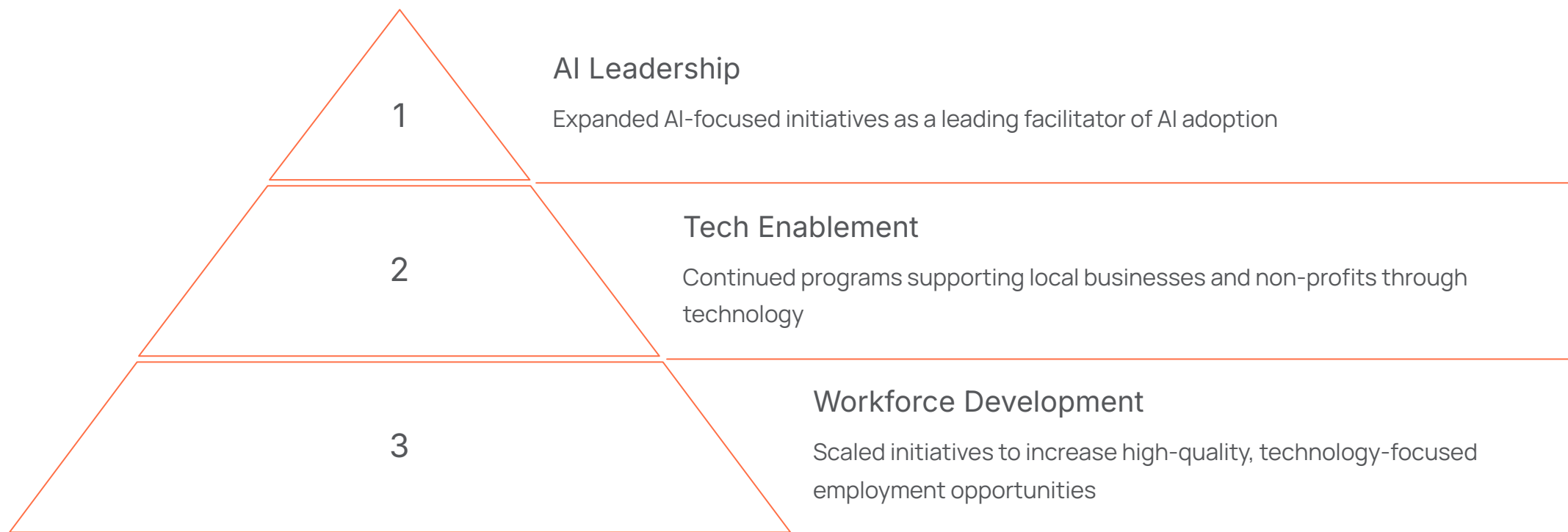

Financial Overview

In 2024, TRUE effectively secured and managed significant financial resources, including grants and sponsorships, to support its numerous initiatives. Key funding included a \$150,000 City & County of Honolulu Grant-in-Aid for the Homeless Care Coordination App initiative, along with sponsorships from 23 organizations for events like the Hawaii AI & Cloud Innovation Summit.

TRUE demonstrated meticulous financial stewardship, emphasizing transparency and accountability in managing these funds. Regular financial reports and audits ensured responsible and strategic allocation, maximizing impact and efficiency across all initiatives and programs.

TRUE plans to enhance its role with more AI-specific use cases and strategic sessions designed to guide Hawaii's organizations through transformative technological shifts. The Community Innovation Mentorship Program will be expanded to empower more organizations to achieve operational excellence through technology.
